




NEW AT THE BOOK TABLE: Discipling: How to Help Others Follow Jesus, by Mark Dever. BCC takes discipleship seriously, obeying Christ's command to "make disciples of all nations," beginning in our own church body. But what does this command actually entail? What does it look like for Christians to care for one another's spiritual wellbeing and growth? In this introduction to the basics of discipling, veteran pastor and author Mark Dever uses biblical definitions and practical examples to show how Christians can help one another become more like Christ every day.






SINGLES GROUP: The Lord has blessed us with a multitude of beneficial ministries to help with a diverse grouping of people at BCC; ranging from special needs, to mommies with littles, to men's study groups, the wonderful theology discussions led by Pastor Brian, and even the occasional grandparents class. There seems to be a growing number who share my own condition that might be in need of just the same comfort. This "condition" is singleness, and it is often a delicate balance of frustration (that can lead to poor decisions), along with pleading to God for a change, idolizing a possible relationship that may never conform to our dream woman/man, and a litany of other possibilities. But, often neglected in the discussion is the biblical goodness of being single.

Recently I read a wonderful work by Barry Danylak, *Redeeming Singleness: How the Storyline of Scripture Affirms the Single Life*. A recent Amazon reviewer writes, "Though marriage is highly esteemed throughout Scripture, the Bible also affirms singleness as an important calling for some Christians. *Redeeming Singleness* expounds a theology of singleness that shows how the blessings of the covenant are now directly mediated to believers through Christ. *Redeeming Singleness* offers an in-depth examination of the redemptive history from which biblical singleness emerges... As the trend toward singleness in the church increases, the need for constructive theological reflection likewise grows. *Redeeming Singleness* meets this need, providing encouragement to those who are single or ministering to singles and challenging believers from all walks of life to reflect more deeply on the sufficiency of Christ."
