



**SOMETHING SMALL, AND SOMETHING BIG AT THE BOOK TABLE:** First, the small: *Church History 101: Highlights of Twenty Centuries.* This summary of the defining event of each Christian century is a reprint from the *Reformation Heritage KJV Study Bible*. If you don't need a new study Bible but would like to learn some church history in an easy to absorb format, check out this little book.





AND... THE BIG: The Doctrine of the Word of God by John Frame. In this world where so many Christians seem continually hungry for extra-biblical revelation, wanting to "hear from God," John Frame's 640 page magnus opus begins, "The main contention of this volume is that God's speech to man is real speech. It is very much like one person speaking to another. God speaks to us so we can understand him and respond appropriately...My thesis is that God's word, in all its qualities and aspects, is a personal communication from him to us." Recommended by most Reformed luminaries you can think of, J.I. Packer caps it off by writing the Forward, in which he calls this volume, next to the Bible itself, "magisterial" (authoritative-I looked it up) and "indispensable."

Because of your help, here are samples of JETS' impact today:

- JETS continues to draw students from the various Arab countries. With the development of the faculty and staff, it is a privilege to watch the profound growth and progress of the students as they develop skill in the Scriptures, in theology, in spiritual life and in the various ministry tools.
- -Today our graduates serve in 21 countries, 12 of which are Arabic-speaking countries, and 9 are non-Arab countries where there are large populations of Arabs.
- Some of the locations of service in Arab countries are difficult and sometimes very dangerous, such as in Syria, Iraq, Sudan and Southern Sudan. But graduates serve faithfully with amazing stories. Here are some examples:
  - A couple from Aleppo, Syria, came to JETS, having lost everything. But they excelled in their 2 years of study. With much tears, they were commissioned last summer at graduation to return to serve in war-torn Syria.
  - In Jordan, 70% of the churches are pastored by JETS graduates.
  - Church-planting in both Sudan and Southern Sudan do so with against great odds.
  - In El Cajon, a suburb of San Diego, CA, there are over 50,000 Iraqi refugees. We have 9 JETS graduates there that have planted three thriving churches amongst them.
