

AT THE BOOK TABLE: Consider Your Calling: Six Questions for Discerning Your Vocation by Gordon T. Smith. What on earth is God doing? Who are you? What are your life circumstances? What is the cross you will have to bear? What are you afraid of? We ask these six critical questions—and then we ask them again—at points of transition in our lives. They all lead us to the one core question: What is the good work to which I am called? This short book helps us to explore our calling from God, whatever stage of life we find ourselves in. UPDATE FROM PASTOR SAM

Dear BCC,

Like Harare, Ulongwe, Malawi is receiving a lot of rain and when it is not raining it will be hot and a bit humid. I trust you are doing well.

Today we finished the third conference with church leaders including deacons, church administrators and their wives at Ulongwe Baptist Church. We had about six pastors and their wives too. These brought their leaders to the training and I must say we now understand why they never wanted to mix with them. While the pastors have little training, their deacons have greater need to be trained. One wonders really what the church leaders, the pastors are doing to equip them.



They are heavily influenced by their culture and Islam in their relationships with their wives and families. Today we discovered that quite a number of the men physically abuse their wives and others have extramarital relationships that are known to the wives.

Having realized their lack of scriptural knowledge, I taught them from Acts 6:1-7, and it made them aware they did not have the biblical qualifications to be deacons and above all did not truly know Christ. Their English is not good. I had to interview them and will transcribe it. The new pastor of Ulongwe Baptist Church, pastor Banda today told me that he raised his hand to receive Jesus because we had explained to him well enough for him to understand that our God is different from Allah and that is why he had asked if there was a difference between the two during the training.



I will write you more tomorrow but we brought 45 dresses and 12 T-shirts made by Bear Creek Church ladies and we will be giving these away tomorrow morning to the less privileged. So thankful some young people will go home smiling tomorrow.
