- 1- Genesis begins with the creation of the heaven and the earth (1:1ff). Revelation ends with the "re-creation," and the new heaven and earth (21:1).
- 2- Genesis begins with sin and pain and death (ch. 3). Revelation ends with no more sin, no more pain or tears, and no more death (21:4).
- 3- Genesis begins with a paradise in the Garden (Gen. 2:8ff). Revelation ends with the paradise of Heaven (21:4).
- 4- Genesis beings with the theme of marriage (2:8). Revelation ends with the great wedding of the Lamb (21:9).
- 5- Genesis begins with the evil of the serpent's lies and deception (3:1ff). Revelation ends with the serpent's destruction (20:10).
- 6- Genesis begins with the horrid curse put on our world (3:14ff). Revelation ends with that curse being lifted (22:3).
- 7- Genesis begins with the creation of day, night, and oceans (1:3; 10; 14). Revelation ends with no more need for day (sun), or night, or oceans (21:1; 22:5).
- 8- Genesis begins with the tree of life among the people of God (2:9). Revelation ends with the "tree of Life" among the people of God (22:2).
- 9- Genesis begins with Adam and Eve (2:7ff). Revelation ends with people "from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages (7:9).
- 10-Genesis begins with God dwelling with His people (2:8; 3:8). Revelation ends with God finally, victoriously, wonderfully dwelling with his people again (21:3) forever and ever and ever.
- C. John Piper: Seeing and Savoring Jesus Christ

"He is sovereign over all! He is supreme!

He is supreme in every admirable way over everything, over all the galaxies and all the endless reaches of space. Supreme over the earth from the top of Mt. Everest 29,000 feet up, to the bottom of the Pacific Ocean 30,000 feet down in the Mariana Trench.

He's supreme over all the plants and animals, from the peaceful whale to the microscopic killer viruses. He's supreme over all the weather movements, hurricanes, tornadoes, monsoons, tsunamis, earthquakes, avalanches, floods, snows, rain, sleet.

He's supreme over all the chemical processes that heal, destroy cancer, AIDS, malaria, flu. All the workings of antibiotics and 1000 healing medicines, he's supreme over that.

He's supreme over all the countries, and all the governments, and all the armies. He's supreme over Al-Qaeda, ISIS, and terrorists, and kidnappings, and suicide bombings and beheadings. He's supreme over Kim Jong-un and Bashar al-Assad. He's supreme over nuclear threats and chemical threats to and from the U.S. And all the rogue regimes in the world.

He's supreme over politics and elections, and lowa caucuses. He's supreme over media, and news, and entertainment and sports, and leisure and education, and universities. Scholarships, science research, business finance industry, manufacturing, transportation, the internet, and information systems.

As Abraham Piper said, "There's not one square inch on planet earth where Jesus Christ doesn't say, "MINE!!"

And he rules that little inch everywhere in the universe. Oh, that God Almighty would grant you to see and savor the supremacy of Jesus. That he would grant you to be satisfied with all that God is for you in Jesus. Oh, that he would grant you simply to trust Jesus."
