

AT THE BOOK TABLE: *Life Together* by Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Bonhoeffer is famous for publicly opposing Hitler as a pastor, resisting the German state's (mostly successful) attempt to co-opt the church, and heartbreakingly being executed just days before the American liberation. There are so many lessons to be learned from Bonhoeffer, and this book is at the top for me. It's been a long time since an author impacted me so deeply. I rarely read a book more than once (always on to the next), but I am now reading this for the third time since

summer. *Life Together* teaches us essentially how to be a Christian: life in community "under the Word." It is a primer, but so rich that a long time believer will find much to correct as well as encourage. C.S. Lewis exhorted us to read old books to expose our cultural blind spots; this book is valuable in showing us the emptiness and falseness of "Jesus and me" lone ranger Christianity. It is also honest about the difficulties we face in "life together." Bonhoeffer's father was a psychologist when psychology was all the rage in Germany. Perhaps that is part of what gives him such depth of understanding of the human psyche, while rejecting importing psychology into Christian doctrine (another valuable corrective to our times). He writes about loneliness, fellowship, devotional life, communal life, the necessity of solitude, love as patiently respecting others' freedom to wrestle with the gospel and their problems, and much more. His chapter on ministry is alone worth the price of the book, as he explains the necessity of listening, active helpfulness, and bearing with one another to prepare the way for the ministry of the Word. A little over 100 pages, it has become one of my all time favorite Christian works. Wish I'd encountered it twenty years ago. The perfect follow-up to Bill Pritchett's recent message on being part of a local church. -L. Barton
