

## NEW AT THE BOOK TABLE:



From Rachel Olstad: I haven't quite finished reading it yet, but I can already tell that *The Life We Never Expected* by Andrew and Rachel Wilson is going to be a goto favorite. Subtitled, *Hopeful Reflections on the Challenges of Parenting Children with Special* 

Needs, it is conveniently divided up into 5 cycles each of weeping, worshiping, waiting, witnessing, and...breathe. Theologically rich and filled with good story-telling of real life events, it is profoundly, yet practically hopeful. One of my favorite sections (so far) is in Cycle 1: Worshiping, where Rachel tells about wanting to spend her life on the mission field serving disadvantaged people. She recalls quoting from Ruth 1:16 to God in a vow of servitude: "Your people shall be my people," and then coming to realize that her gifts and talents were not wasted because the two little people with autism for whom she stays at home and off the mission field, ARE God's people, and hers now, too. God's call to sacrifice has a different economy than the world's, just as it did when the woman broke the alabaster of expensive perfume on Jesus' feet. Special Needs Parents, we are serving Jesus greatly by lovingly meeting our children's needs. I can't wait to finish this book, and then re-read it many times in order to keep gleaning new insight that I still need (or especially need) in this season of my life.
