UPDATE FROM THE BENSONS IN BRAZIL: We are involved in a small way with the Alive group at the large Presbyterian Church we attend. These are mostly youth, some adults, with mission hearts and a desire to learn English. We meet on Saturday afternoons, and have a contemporary type service in English, frequently translated to Portuguese and afterward and before conversations in English. Pastor Djard is also the pastor in charge of the English-speaking mission teams that come from the States. There are 5-6 churches who have partnerships with our church IPM (Presby. Church of Manaus) Our church is in the reformed tradition (like Bear Creek) So he stays in contact with these US churches, and when teams visit they usually come to the Alive and share. He also supervises the missionaries of small churches out in the river communities between Maues and Manacaparu on the Amazon River and it's tributaries. (Other pastors supervise other churches in other parts of the Amazon and the Rio Negro. IPM has about 60 churches in river communities.)

Pastor Djard and Alive participants also take responsibility for the English Camp held every July, that camp is billed as an intensive week of English, it's also a fun camp time with a goal of evangelizing the non-Christians who come for the English. A team of youth comes from a church in Chicago area to help teach the English classes and make new Brazilian friends. 340 kids come; about half are nominal or non-Christians.


Three years ago we started having small English camps in river communities, we started with two communities, this year we are going to 6. These are 3-day events, held over a long holiday weekend. If you have anyone at BCC at all interested in coming for one of these times, I will get the name of a contact person in the states so you can ask lots of questions, etc.

The library at PAZ church is still going, (I'm afraid I have heavily stacked the shelves with authors I trust when I can find translated books (I have a couple of guys reading books by Piper and Timothy Keller, which at PAZ I consider progress) I'm training someone to take my place. We are also helping the pastor at one of the other PAZ churches start a library there).









## THE SPRING SEASON OF TOPSoccer IS HERE!

TOPSoccer is a recreational activity for families of children with disabilities and their typical siblings. Organized by Bear Creek Church volunteers in cooperation with Youth Soccer and the Rogue Valley Timbers Soccer Club, this unique program enables special athletes to play at levels consistent with their skills, not necessarily their age. Volunteers need to have attended BCC for at least 6 months and be 14 or older. 12 & 13 year-olds can volunteer, but must have a parent/guardian accompany and participate along with them. TOPSoccer takes place each Thursday, beginning April 6<sup>th</sup> at Abraham Lincoln Elementary School. Volunteers will help out from 6:15-7:45pm. more than inspire. I learned about this one at a wedding shower and decided to pick it up for the book table. Then I decided to read the first few paragraphs. Before I knew it, I had finished the thing. This is a great book. An amazon reviewer puts it well: "It looks like a marriage book, and it

sounds like a marriage book, but it's not REALLY a book on marriage. It's really a book about having the eternal view of every aspect of life, including marriage and parenting. It's a book about seeking first the Kingdom of God and everything else, including a healthy marriage, flowing from that. And it's about seeing everything you have, including your marriage, as something to be used for the mission of God in this world." This means that anyone who is newly married, long time married, wants to be married, or wishes they weren't married, can be encouraged by this book. Seriously. Check it out.
