		1-	If we don't take Genesis chapters 1 through 3 at face value as the divinely revealed history of creation, or if we see Genesis as merely "" or "poetic" or "allegorical" or "mythical," then the Bible's explanation of how sin entered the world makes no sense.				
		2-	And if we didn't fall in Adam, we cannot be in Christ, because Christ's position as the head of the redeemed race exactly parallels Adam's position as the head of the fallen race (1 Cor. 15:22; Romans 5:18-19).
